

George Merriam of Concord in New England in the County of Middlesex, being in
good memory has made this my last will & Testament in manner & form: as following

head of the open field: eight acres of land by the subulls near the meadow:
fifty seven acres of land & forty five acres of land at the lower end of Elmbrook
meadow: thirteen acres of meadow called Birge meadow to be equally divided between
them as they shall agree among them selves, or upon non agreement, by a committee
mutually chosen by them;
