In Kalamazoo, Ron demonstrated his passion for peace and justice by participating in "night ministry" a service to share God's love and mercy to people of the street. He also participated in demonstrations and actions against racism and war efforts against foreign nations through his involvement in the Institute for Global Education, the Michigan Federation for Social Action, and the Grand Rapids Peace and Justice Community. This past June, he was honored as Peacemaker of the Year by the 2008 West Michigan United Methodist Annual Conference. Ron also served as Chairperson of the Archives and History Commission, President of the Michigan Area United Methodist Historical Society, Chair of the Board of Global Ministries and the Commission on Equitable Salary. During his retirement, Ron continued to be involved in ministries by volunteering at Clark Retirement Community, Oakdale United Methodist Church and many other local organizations. Ron enjoyed many hobbies including fishing, repairing and caning chairs, playing chess with his grandchildren, genealogy, researching history, and sharing his knowledge of nature and care of the environment with his family. He was especially fond of spending time at the cottage on Bass Lake in Pierson, MI. Cremation has taken place per Ron's wishes.
